Year Group Updates

Zebras and Hippos have had a fantastic half term with our topic 'The Zoo'. From virtual zoo visits, to some very special deliveries, we have all enjoyed learning about the different animals we might find both there, and in the wild!

Reception started the half term as detectives, investigating who had left paw prints in their classroom. After much predicting the children checked the CCTV footage and discovered it was a wolf in search of the three pigs. The children explored various materials to help the three pigs to make wolf-proof houses. They also used their investigation skills to help the Gingerbread man cross the river safely. They realised he couldn't get wet or he would turn to mush! They used their new materials knowledge to build bridges and boats to help him safely cross. The children explored the ingredients that are required to make gingerbread men and wrote their own ingredients lists and instructions. They finished the half term receiving a letter from the baker who needed their help. They had to find the missing gingerbread men who had run away as fast as they could. The children had to solve some tricky addition and subtraction problems in order to help find them. They were rewarded with a gingerbread man as their prize to eat!

Year 1's topic has been AFRICA. The children have been making clay pots, practising their sewing skills by making African bags, with a printed repeated pattern and preparing for their African Market at the end of the half term.

Year 2 have been busy this half term using their DT skills to make moving vehicles and new car mats for the children in Reception.

We have enjoyed learning about position and direction and mapping in forest schools too.

This term, Year 3 have taken on the challenge of being the school apprentices! Their mission has been to help improve the learning experiences in nursery and work tirelessly to develop new and innovative products! They have been learning about light and shadows to develop a fantastic shadow puppet show. Their wonderful understanding of levers and linkages allowed them to create beautifully crafted interactive children's book pages.
